



Bill Burrows grew up on the working class streets in Melbourne's Industrial West in the 1950's and 60's, a landscape that has all but disappeared with gentrification and development. Bill paints glimpses of his remembered childhood. The sea, boats and navigation, horses, boys and dogs, are regular subjects.

'My paintings spring from my inner vision, they are sensed as much as seen. Figurative and narrative themes explore metaphor and symbols of love, sex, fear, loss, grief, anxiety and insecurity. Reality and mysticism are combined. I explore the tension between the layers of paint, and marks on the surface, the magic when an idea is brought to life on canvas.'

Bill has enjoyed a long and stellar career as an internationally acclaimed yet extremely humble designer. His heart has always been with painting and expressing himself which now consumes most of his time along with his young family.

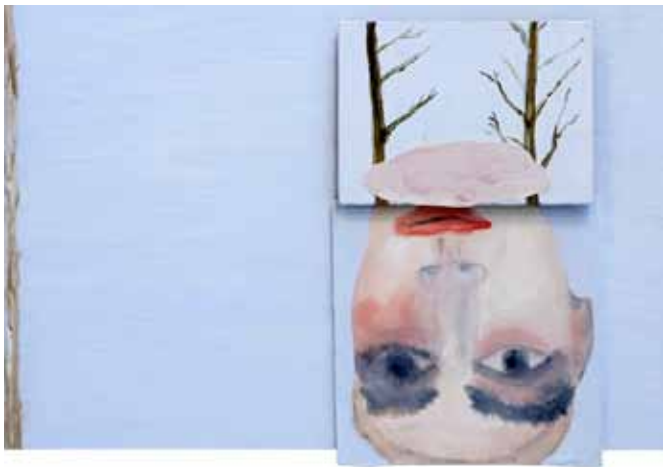
